# What is the Scholarship Ministry? How are the donations used in the monthly pink envelope?

## Mission Statement

“To provide inner city youth with the opportunity to break the cycle of poverty by providing educational assistance and developmental support.”

This program serves approximately 40 children per year with grave personal problems that put them at risk of dropping out of high school. It is called the Lavatus Powell Program (LPP) and it provides academic, social/emotional, spiritual, behavioral, and financial support; and structure with a caring, disciplined approach involving a collaboration of interested adults. This is intensive one-on-one support with accountability, collaboration, and communication involving the student, the parent/guardian, and all key adults working for the student's success.

The Scholarship Ministry at Good Shepherd provides financial assistance only in the form of partial tuition payments for the students. Forty thousand dollars was donated each year for the first six years of the program and this past year we fell slightly short of that total to help finance between 26-39 students per year at Purcell Marian High School. In addition, over 30 parishioners are involved personally by providing: on-going tutoring, mentoring, and other program needs for these students.

As we have shared before, this program has a great track record. Ninety-six percent of the LPP students have completed high school. Sixty-four percent of LPUSP (Lavatus Powell Urban Student Program) students have gone on to additional educational programs, with 31% going on to four year colleges. The rest of the graduates (5%) have gone to the military or found gainful employment after high school. We are helping to turn lives around and assure success!

We would like to continue our current level of financial support of this strong program. (Donations in the pink monthly envelope would need to increase for us to do this.) We are still looking for mentors, especially men, who are willing to guide a young man to success.

## Basics of Judaism

Over the past few years, Good Shepherd has put on a number of Interfaith discussions and classes which have been very well received. Last summer, there were an average of 30 people who attended our “Basics of Islam” sessions. On Tuesday evenings during June and July, 2012, Good Shepherd is offering a “Basics of Judaism” course which will be taught by Rabbi Matthew Kraus, Director of Undergraduate Studies, Department of Judaic Studies, University of Cincinnati.

Rabbi Kraus will discuss the history of key events of Jewish memory (creation of the world, Exodus from Egypt, destruction of the first temple, restoration, and destruction of the second temple, the rabbinic period, medieval martyrdom, expulsion from Spain, holocaust); rabbinic literature (Midrash and Talmud); practices outside the home

(synagogue and holy days) as well as inside the home (Shabbat, kashrut, family purity); and the theology of Judaism (God, Torah, Israel, ethics, as well as the different movements in Judaism).

“Basics of Judaism” will begin on June 5 and will run until July 17 with no class on July 3. Each session will be from 7:00 until 8:30 p.m. with the format being lecture by Rabbi Kraus followed by a time for questions and answers. There is no charge. ## Liturgy Commission

The *Liturgy Commission* is seeking one (1) new selected member this year to serve a three (3) year term. Two members will also be appointed to the commission. The Commission advises and consults with the pastor and the staff of the parish. It has responsibility for the well-being of the parish regarding liturgy, prayer, and Sacraments. We are looking for an active Good Shepherd parishioner who has a basic understanding of liturgy and prayer to serve on this commission. Members are expected to contribute four (4) to five (5) hours monthly including attendance at the monthly meeting.

## Pastoral Care and Outreach Commission

The *Pastoral Care and Outreach Commission* is seeking two (2) selected members to serve a three (3) year term. Two (2) members will also be appointed to the commission this year. This commission has been established to provide consultation and input on any and all of the pastoral care and outreach aspects of our parish. This includes a comprehensive, holistic model of pastoral care for those within our geographical boundaries. It also includes a focused effort of outreach and social justice in our community, the nation, and the world. Members are expected to attend two (2) hour meetings every other month.

## Education and Formation Commission

The *Education and Formation Commission* consists of four (4) subcommissions of four (4) members each focusing on adult programs, children's programs, junior high and high school programs, and family life programs. The commission is seeking three (3) selected members to serve a term of three (3) years: one (1) each for the Adult, Jr. High/Senior High and Children's subcommissions. Two (2) members will also be appointed to the following subcommissions: one (1) for the Adult; and one (1) for the Jr. High/Senior High. It is the role of the commission to advise and consult with the pastor and staff of the parish. It has responsibility for the well-being of the parish regarding religious education and formation for parishioners of all ages. We are looking for people who are familiar with our formation programs either through ministry or participation and people with fresh perspectives. The Commission currently meets on a quarterly basis. Meetings last approximately two (2) hours.

## Finance Commission

The *Finance Commission* provides consultation to the pastor and staff in the areas of stewardship, money management, and accounting. The commission consists of six (6) appointed members and three (3) selected members. This year we are seeking one (1) selected member to serve a three (3) year term. Two (2) members will also be appointed to the commission. The selected member is not required to have expertise in the areas of finance or accounting. We are looking for someone who has a basic understanding of budgeting, and an interest in stewardship education. The selected member will serve a three (3) year term. This is a monthly three (3) hour commitment.

## Scripture for Next Week – The Feast of Pentecost by Fr. Bob Schmitz

Acts chapter 2 verses 1-11: In Jewish tradition, Pentecost is a pilgrimage feast. Believers from all over come to Jerusalem. For Christians, it is a feast that marks the fulfillment of the old and the beginning of the new world. The signs that accompany the Spirit come from the old covenant: the noise is a reminder of the thunder that was heard from Mt. Sinai; the wind reminds us of the whirlwind from which God spoke to Job; the tongues of fire are a reminder of the burning bush through which God spoke to Moses. The new world is marked by the universality of salvation that the Christian covenant aspires to. All humankind is called by God into a renewed creation.

1 Corinthians chapter 12 verses 3-7 and 12-13: The proclamation that Jesus is Lord has multiple dimensions. It speaks of the equality of Jesus with God. Note it does not say Christ is Lord, but Jesus, the man, is Lord and equal to God. This revelation is possible only in the Spirit. The statement also has meaning for our day to day lives. If Jesus is truly Lord then everything else is secondary. Only by living in the Spirit could we aspire to such a life. And finally, since Christ lives in us, all the diverse gifts given to each one of us serves the common good of building the kingdom of God.

The Gospel—John chapter 20 verses 19-23: This Gospel was also proclaimed on the second Sunday of Easter. The emphasis today is on the gift of the Spirit. Breathing upon the disciples recalls how God began creating in Genesis, his divine breath as a creative wind hovered over the abyss. So the Spirit we are given is a creative one, able to reconcile this world and bring us peace.

OR

The Gospel—John chapter 15 verses 26-27 and chapter 16 verses 12-15: The Spirit is called the Advocate. Jesus sends the Spirit to us in order for the Spirit to testify about Jesus to us. The Advocate will stay with the Church and guide us through time with the divine truth.

We receive calls from parishioners interested in donating furniture, appliances and household goods. This is much appreciated! Here are some options:

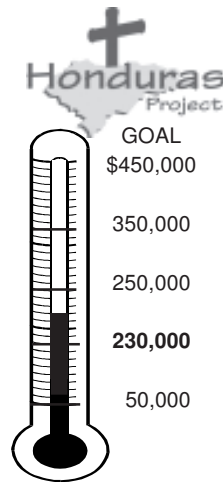
### ST. VINCENT de PAUL

*We affirm life* as a precious gift from God.

*We raise up vocations* to the priesthood and religious life.

## Introducing the Kroger Community Rewards Program – New for 2012

The Kroger Company has implemented a new program that will replace the *Kroger Neighborhood Rewards* program we've had in place at Good Shepherd over the past few years. The new program will now be known as the *Kroger Community Rewards* program. The Kroger Company will pay up to \$1,250,000 on a quarterly basis to participating organizations based on their percentage of spending as it relates to the total spending of all participating *Kroger Community Rewards* organizations.

### Ministry to the Dying: Anointing and/or Viaticum

If a person is near death, he or she may be anointed. However, if the dying person is able to swallow, it is recommended that they receive the Eucharist as Viaticum. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick ought to be celebrated at the beginning of an illness. Viaticum is to be celebrated when death is close. The Eucharist, given as Viaticum, is food for the passage through death to eternal life. A priest or a deacon may give Viaticum to the dying person. When a priest is unavailable, it is important that the deacon visit the dying to pray with that person and the family and offer Viaticum. Please call the parish office (489-8815). After hours, please leave a message about the location of the dying person and your contact phone number. That message will be relayed to a priest or deacon.

### Reconciliation (Confessions)

Tuesdays from 5:30-6:15 p.m. in the Reconciliation Room in the chapel. Those attending the Sacrament can enter through the doors to the chapel, prepare in the chapel and enter the Reconciliation Room when they see the priest is not occupied with another penitent.

## TERRY'S MUSINGS (Spiritual or not) Notes from Fr. Terry

We are closing on having used the Third Edition of the Roman Missal for six months. How are we doing? There are times when I still stumble over the word order. I may not get used to it until the Lord comes in glory! Here is more explanation of the words of the Roman Missal that are not part of everyday language.

PASCHAL: Refers to Christ's work of Redemption accomplished through his Passion, Death, Resurrection and Ascension. We celebrate the Paschal Mystery in the Liturgy and become more aware of the forgiveness and the life of the Holy Spirit which is given us. Christ's Paschal Mystery is going on in our lives every day in obvious and subtle ways – birth, death, rebirth or life, death, resurrection.

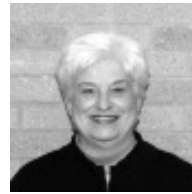

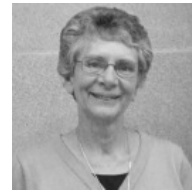
